- (c) all streets on Russell Island between the eastern end of Ocean Heights Subdivision and the western end of Ocean Estates Subdivision.
- (3) The speed limit on all streets on Russell Island which are east of Ocean Heights Subdivision and west of Ocean Estates Subdivision shall be thirty miles per hour.
- (4) The speed limit on the bridge connecting St. George's Cay to Russell Island and on the bridge south of the dry dock on South Road shall be ten miles per hour.
- (5) The speed limit in any designated school zone shall be fifteen miles per hour between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. on school days.
7. The provisions of regulation 6 of these Regulations shall not apply to a vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for the fire brigade, an ambulance or police purposes if the observance of these provisions would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.
8. Whoever commits an offence against any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable on summary conviction to the penalties prescribed for breach of the speed limit set out in section 43 of the Road Traffic Act.

ROAD TRAFFIC (MOTOR CYCLES) (PROTECTIVE HELMETS) REGULATIONS

S.I. 44/1975

(SECTION 98)

[Commencement 1st July, 1975]

1. The Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Motor Cycles) (Protective Helmets) Regulations.
2. Every person driving and riding on a motor cycle shall wear at all times a protective helmet of the shape, construction or other qualities set out in regulation 3 of these Regulations.
3. Protective helmets referred to in regulation 2 of these Regulations shall conform to the standards set by the International Organization for Standardization.

Offences.

4. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction, in the case of a first offence, to a fine of one hundred dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, and in the case of a second or subsequent offence, to a fine of two hundred dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months.
