**ROAD TRAFFIC (PUBLIC SERVICE DRIVERS)  
(OMNIBUSES, TOUR CARS, LIVERY CARS AND  
TAXI CABS) (STANDARD OF APPEARANCE AND  
DRESS) REGULATIONS, 1992**

S.I. 92/1992

(SECTION 38)

*[Commencement 20th November, 1992]*

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Public Service Drivers) (Omnibuses, Tour Cars, Livery Cars and Taxi Cabs) (Standard of Appearance and Dress) Regulations, 1992.

Citation.

**2.** In these Regulations “winter season” means that period commencing on the 15th day of December of each year and ending on the 15th day of April in the succeeding year.

Interpretation.

**3.** (1) While driving passengers for hire or reward during the winter season, every driver of an omnibus, a tour car, a livery car or a taxi cab shall wear —

Standard of dress during winter season.

(a) in the case of a male driver, a white or light-coloured shirt with a collar designed for wearing a necktie, a necktie, and a dark pair of trousers; and

(b) in the case of a female driver, a white or light-coloured blouse or shirt with a collar designed for wearing a necktie, a necktie, and a dark skirt or a dark pair of trousers.

(2) During the winter season a driver may also wear a coat or a jacket and a chauffeur’s cap.

**4.** While driving passengers for hire or reward during any time of the year other than the winter season, every driver of an omnibus, a tour car, a livery car or a taxi cab may wear —

Standard of dress during other times of the year.

(a) in the case of a male driver, a tropical print shirt and a light-coloured or a dark pair of trousers; and

(b) in the case of a female driver, a tropical print blouse or shirt and a light-coloured or a dark skirt or a light-coloured or a dark pair of trousers.

Footwear and  
cleanliness.

**5.** While driving passengers for hire or reward, every driver of an omnibus, a tour car, a livery car or a taxi cab —

- (a) shall wear shoes, other than sandals, slippers and tennis shoes; and
- (b) shall ensure that he or she is always clean and tidy in appearance.

Fine.

**6.** Every driver of an omnibus, a tour car, a livery car or a taxi cab driver who fails without reasonable cause to comply with the prescribed standard of appearance and dress commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars.

## **ROAD TRAFFIC AND SPEED LIMIT (ELEUTHERA) REGULATIONS**

Citation.

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic and Speed Limit (Eleuthera) Regulations.

Interpretation.

**2.** In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires —

“Controller” means the Commissioner for the District of Governor’s Harbour, Eleuthera, or the Commissioner for the District of Rock Sound, Eleuthera, or the Commissioner for the Harbour Island District;

“District of Governor’s Harbour” means the District of Governor’s Harbour as determined by the Minister under the provisions of the Local Government Act;

“District of Harbour Island” means the District of Harbour Island as determined by the Minister under the provisions of the Local Government Act;
